Ice Cube in the 'Raw'

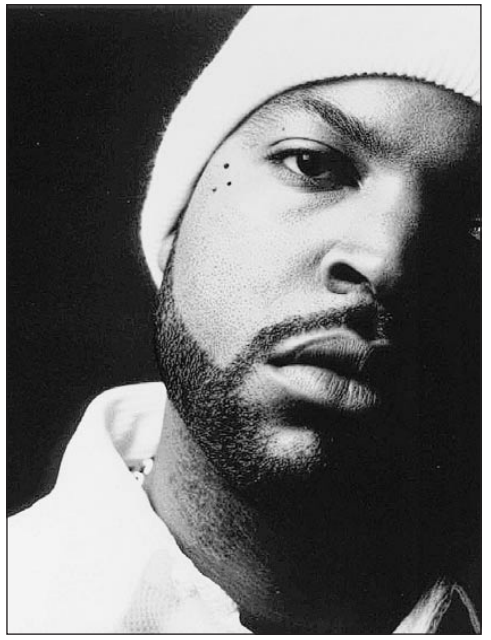

They range from tiny incense boxes to 6-foot wall installations. Artists represented include Kitaoji Rosanjin (1883-1959), considered one of the great Japanese ceramic artists.
